Semester Highlights

- **Mar.** AUA and Save Incapacity Teenagers begin coordinating the response to a new HIV cluster in Peam Village, Kandal province.
- **Mar.** Staff training in Positive Prevention and Boosted Integrated Active Case Management held in Kep.

What's Next?

Continue to **strengthen collaboration and communication** between pre-ART/ART staff and NGO partners to improve access to services.

Increase the number of people tested for HIV/AIDS and use the Risk Tracing Snowball approach to identify and trace partners of PLHIV.

Continue to collaborate with Save Incapacity Teenagers to **respond to the new HIV cluster in Peam Village**, Kandal province.

Cooperate with the Department of Identification of Poor Households (Ministry of Planning) to **organize a HIV/AIDS advocacy meeting** in Kampong Cham to discuss and advocate IDPoor for PLHIV families.

Provide an opportunity for 60 AUA members to participate in an **exchange visit** at a pre-ART/ART clinic in another province. Participants will share their experiences and learn about self-help group income generation activities in the host community.

Organize a **PLHIV Rights Advocacy Workshop** with key stakeholders, NGO partners and service providers in Phnom Penh.

Work with a consultant to review AUA's vision and mission and **design** a new 5-Year Strategic Plan.



What's Next?

Continue to conduct monitoring and supervision visits to AUA sites to strengthen reporting systems and project implementation.

Conduct a Data Quality Audit at AUA Kampong Cham to **improve data** collection and management.

Hold an **Annual Membership Meeting** to inform members about AUA's achievements and future direction.

Hold a **Board Selection Meeting** to discuss AUA's new mandate.

Organize the **Annual Project Review Meeting** with all AUA staff from Phnom Penh and Kampong Cham.
